



# police Blotter

## Fight erupts over branches

(Editors note: The Bee's police blotter is a sampling of unusual, sometimes humorous calls received by the police department. It is not intended to be a complete record of all incidents reported.)

### Friday, Oct. 13

- Two arrests were made on Allenhurst Road of two men who were running from house to house. They were charged with disorderly conduct.

- Police responded to Tops Markets on Transit Road to assist a woman and her 9-year-old daughter who were in the vestibule and had been stranded for three hours.
