The programs will then feature Concertmaster Ludwig as soloist in two exquisite masterpieces from the violin repertoire: Chausson's haunting "Poeme" offers a poignant and touching reverie, the perfect prelude to the lyrical virtuosity of Sarasate's "Carmen Fantasy."
