The couple honeymooned in Aruba.

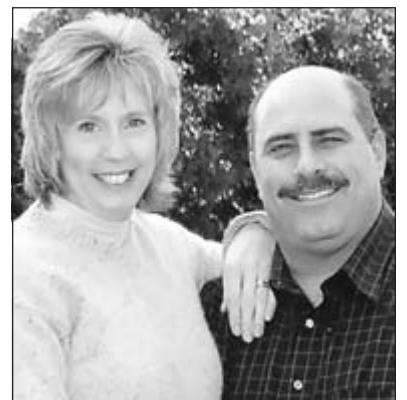
Snyder-Braunscheidel
